

NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that under the First Part of Chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, known as the Companies Act, letters patent have been issued under the seal of the Secretary of State of Canada, bearing date the 1st day of January, 1912, incorporating Frank Evans, of the Town of Prince Rupert, in the Province of British Columbia, and John Gilbert Bealy, broker, Richmond, W.Y., Hart, barrister-at-law, George Merle Miller, student-at-law, Pearl Stokoe and Jessie Strachan, stenographers, and Wmifred Moran, clerk, all six of the city of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario, for the following purposes, viz: (a) To hunt for, kill and take whales, seals and fish and other marine animals of every kind, and the coast of British Columbia and elsewhere, and manufacture, cure and pack the several products thereof and market the same, and to act as general traders in these products; (b) To acquire, purchase, rent, hold, sell and rent fishing licenses for pout, herring, salmon, trout, net, fish wheels and other fixed appliances and nets; (c) To acquire, hold, sell, lease, rent and dispose of locations upon which to construct and maintain pound nets, traps, weirs, set nets, fish wheels and other appliances, whether fixed or movable for catching or retaining fish; (d) To acquire, purchase, catch, take, buy, hold, store, pack, preserve, sell, export, dispose of and distribute of all kinds; and to engage in the propagation of salmon and other food fishes; (e) To carry on the business of warehousing and cold storage company in all its branches, and for that purpose (1) to operate and maintain conveyances for transportation and cold storage by land or water of any and all products, goods or manufactured articles; (2) to issue certificates and warrants negotiable or otherwise, to persons warehousing goods with the company; (3) to raise, purchase, sell and all other farm, field, orchard, garden and dairy products; (4) to conduct abattoirs or slaughter houses, to slaughter all kinds of animals and manufacture, purchase, sell and otherwise deal in meats, fertilizers, fat, fallow and other substances derived from the said animals and carry on the business of pork packing; (5) to establish and maintain wholesale and retail shops and generally to carry on any business undertaking which may be conveniently carried on with the above; (f) To take over a certain contract bearing date the 2nd January, 1912, made between Frank Evans and vendor and C. H. C. Leggett as trustee for the company, and to issue paid-up shares in accordance therewith; (g) To erect, maintain and operate at suitable places, such as stations, factories, warehouses, offices, buildings and works, and the necessary plant, engines, machinery and fixtures and to do all or any of these things that seem to be useful to be done to carry out the objects for which this company is formed and as herein set forth, and to pay for same in whole or in part fully paid-up shares of the company; (h) To build, own, lease, hire, purchase, charter or otherwise acquire and operate steamships and sailing vessels for the purposes of the company, and to build, equip and operate wharves, docks, elevators and other works, buildings or appliances, and collect wharfage and storage charges for the use of its wharves and buildings and in connection therewith to carry passengers and freights and collect charges therefor; (i) To acquire by lease or otherwise the assets, property, plant, machinery, undertaking, business, goodwill and stock in trade or services of any person or company carrying on any trade or business which this company is authorized to carry on, or similar or incidental thereto or capable of being operated in conjunction therewith, to operate and to pay for the same in cash or in shares, bonds or other securities of this company; (j) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to own and hold the shares, bonds or other securities of any manufacturing or other corporation carrying on any business similar to that of the company, notwithstanding the provisions of section 44 of the said Act; (k) To amalgamate with any other company having objects similar to or identical with this company and to pay for same in shares, bonds or other securities, or partly in cash and partly in shares, bonds or other securities of this company, and to operate and carry on the business of such amalgamated company; (l) To allot, issue and deliver as fully paid-up shares, or other securities of the company in payment of sites, licenses, plant, machinery, services, goods or other valuable consideration as may be arranged or agreed upon by the directors of this company; (m) To enter into any arrangement with authorities, municipal, local or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from such authority any rights, privileges and concessions which the company may think desirable to obtain and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions; (n) To draw, make, execute, endorse, discount, accept and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants and other negotiable and transferable instruments; (o) To lend money to customers and others having dealings with the company and to guarantee the performance of contracts by any such persons; (p) To remunerate any person, firm or company for services rendered or to be rendered in placing or assisting to place or guaranteeing the placing of any of the shares of the company's capital or any bonds or other securities of the company, or in or about the formation, production, organization or incorporation of the company or the conduct of its business; (q) To pay all or any costs, charges or expenses preliminary or incidental to anything done in connection with the promotion, organization, formation, establishment, registration and incorporation of this company; (r) To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire, any patent, licenses, concessions and the like, conferring any exclusive or non-exclusive, or limited right to use, or any secret or other information of any invention which may seem expedient or being used for any of the purposes of the company, or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the company, and to use, exercise, develop or grant licenses in respect of, or otherwise turn to the profit, property, rights or information so acquired; (s) To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits, union of interests, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which the company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the company; and to lend money to, guarantee the contracts of, or otherwise assist any such person or company, or to hold, relate, with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with the same; (t) To promote any company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property and liabilities of the company, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly to benefit the company; (u) To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any personal property and any rights or privileges which the company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business, and in particular any machinery, plant, stock in trade; (v) To construct, improve, maintain, work, manage, carry out or control any roads, ways, tramways, branches or sidings on lands owned or controlled by the company, bridges, reservoirs, water-courses, wharves, manufactories, warehouses, electric works, shops, stores and other works and conveniences which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to advance the company's interests, and to contribute to, subsidize or otherwise assist in, or to take part in the construction, improvement, maintenance, working, management, carrying out or control thereof, or to sell or dispose of the undertaking of the company, or any part thereof, for such consideration as the company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures or securities of any other company having objects together or in part similar to those of the company; (aa) To procure the company to be registered in any foreign country and to designate persons therein according to the laws of such foreign country to represent the company and to accept service for and in behalf of the company of any process or suit; (bb) And, generally to carry on any business which may seem to the company capable of being conveniently or profitably carried on.

MERCHANT MARINE GUILD IS ORGANIZED IN VANCOUVER WHENEVER A MASTER OR OFFICER IS IN DANGER OF LOSING HIS CERTIFICATE THE GUILD WILL DEFEND HIM - ALL G. T. P. OFFICERS JOIN.

After being imposed upon for many years and subjected to what they consider harsh and unjust comments and decisions, the captains and officers of British Columbia have joined hands and decided that in the future they shall insist upon fair play in every case. A few evenings ago many seamen gathered in the offices of James & Jarvis, Government street, Vancouver, at the call of Captain Jarvis, and agreed that the Merchant Service Guild of British Columbia be formed. Others who were unable to attend owing to their ships being out of port, sent letters voicing their sentiments and stating that they would abide with whatever action the meeting took.

There appears to be only one body in the province which is opposed to the organization of the Guild, and that is the Vancouver Shipmasters' Association. A pessimistic letter stating that the society in Vancouver was progressing favorably and that at a meeting held recently the members decided to have nothing whatever to do with the new organization was received by Captain Jarvis.

Every master and officer of the Grand Trunk Pacific steamers signed a letter which expressed that they were in favor of the formation of the guild. Most of those in the employ of the C. P. R. were agreed that the organization would be of the greatest benefit to the seafaring men, and the masters and officers of the other companies operating steamers and tugboats wrote to announce that they were in on the new proposition. Captain Jarvis stated that the membership of the society was 45, which shows that the guild is wanted by the mariners. The Victoria pilots, together with the Vancouver and Nanaimo pilots, are glad to see that steps have been taken to protect the seamen of British Columbia.

It was decided at the meeting that only those in active service afloat would be enrolled as members of the guild. The fee for captains was fixed at \$25, for officers at \$15. An office of the organization is to be opened in Vancouver, and applications are to be sent to every British captain and officer who is engaged in active service in this province. Within a very short time it is expected that the present membership will have been doubled.
