"QUEEN ALICE OF ENGLAND" THE UNCROWNED MRS. KEPPEL

BEAUTIFUL LEADER OF SOCIETY IN THE DAYS OF KING EDWARD VII, BANNED FROM COURT OF ENGLAND, STILL WIELDS WOMAN'S SCEPTRE OVER PRINCES.

The recent news from St. Moritz that Mrs. George Keppel is planning an invasion of London society with a view to occupying again the position of leader as in the days of King Edward, is strengthened. It is now reported that she has attached the German crown prince to her train of admirers, and has become the absolute arbiter of fashion at the winter resort.

Mrs. Keppel, it is said, holds daily court at the Palace Hotel, where she is familiarly referred

to as "Queen Alice of England." Although the crown princess is with her husband it is said that all guest lists of royal entertainments pass through the hands of Mrs. Keppel, and she is in effect the court chamberlain to the imperial heir apparent.

Before the arrival of the imperial visitors, Mrs. Keppel was snubbed by several Americans, who only remembered that she was not received at the English court when King George came to the throne, but she became friends with Mrs. John Ward, daughter of the American ambassador, Whitelaw Reid, who was stopping at the same hotel. As soon as she came into power she put those who snubbed her in the background. Since then she has dictated everything, even to the style of dancing at the hotel, summarily ordering that the "turkey trot," then being introduced by several Americans, be barred.

Mrs. Keppel has been out of England eighteen months, spending half of that time at Ceylon in the residence of Sir Thomas Lipton, which he loaned to her after King Edward's death. She returned to Europe via Japan and has been much in Dresden, where her daughter is completing her education.

The Mayor and Aldermen led the applause which followed this splendid speech, and it was discussed at length. The City Engineer was requested to state what acreage there was available and other points. He stated that he had a contour map for every part of it that could be used. It would be wise to consider what part was available and how best be accommodated all who might wish to use it for sports before giving out any at all. There was about twenty-five acres, of which two were taken by the reservoir, four needed for the militia grounds, so there would be ample for athletic grounds and little corners left for parking.

It was then decided that the whole Council, the City Engineer and the representatives of athletic clubs already formed should view the ground at an early date, the tennis ground to be looked into at the same time.
