

NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that under the First Part of Chapter 70 of the Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, known as "The Companies Act," letters patent have been issued under the Seal of the Secretary of State of Canada, bearing date the 12th day of January, 1912, incorporating Frank Evans, of the Town of Prince Rupert, in the Province of British Columbia, merchant; John Gilbert Beatty, broker; Richmond Wylie Hart, barrister-at-law; George Merie Miller, student-at-law; Pearl Stokes and Jessie Strachan, stenographers; and Winifred Morgan, clerk, all six of the City of Toronto, in the Province of Ontario, for the following purposes, viz: (a) To hunt for, kill and take whales, seals and fish and other marine animals of every kind on the coast of British Columbia and elsewhere, and manufacture, cure and pack the several products thereof and market the same, and to act as general traders in these products; (b) To acquire, purchase, run, hold, sell and rent fishing licenses for pound nets, traps, weirs, set nets, fish wheels and other fixed appliances and purse nets; drag seines and other seines and movable appliances for catching fish; (c) To acquire, hold, sell, lease, rent and dispose of locations upon which to construct and maintain pound nets, traps, weirs, fish wheels and other appliances, whether fixed or movable for catching or retaining fish; (d) To acquire, hold, sell, lease, buy, hold, store, pack, preserve, sell, export, dispose of and distribute fish of all kinds and to engage in the propagation of salmon and other food fishes; (e) To carry on the business of warehousing and cold storage in all its branches, and for that purpose (1) to operate and maintain conveyances for transportation and cold storage by land or water of any and all products, goods or manufactured articles; (2) to issue certificates and warrants negotiable or otherwise, to persons warehousing goods with the company; (3) to raise, purchase, sell and otherwise deal in eggs, butter, cream and all other farm, field, orchard, garden and dairy products; (4) to conduct abattoirs or slaughter houses, to slaughter all kinds of animals and manufacture, purchase, sell and otherwise deal in meats, fertilizers, fat, tallow and other substances derived from the said animals and carry on the business of pork packing; (5) to establish and maintain wholesale and retail shops and generally to carry on any business undertaking which may be convenient or carried on with the above; (f) To acquire over a certain contract bearing date the 2nd January, 1912, made between Frank Evans and G. H. C. Leggett, the said company the right to acquire, hold, sell, lease, buy, hold, store, pack, preserve, sell, export, dispose of and distribute fish of all kinds and to engage in the propagation of salmon and other food fishes; (g) To erect, maintain and operate at suitable places, such as stations, factories, warehouses, offices, buildings and works, and the necessary plant, machinery and fixtures and to do all or any of these things that seem to be needful to be done in order to carry out the objects for which the company is formed and as herein set forth, and to pay for same in whole or in part in fully paid-up shares of the company; (h) To build, own, lease, hire, purchase, charter or otherwise acquire and operate steamships and sailing vessels for the purposes of the company, and to build, equip and operate wharves, docks, elevators and other works, buildings, plant, machinery, and collect wharfage and storage charges for the use of its wharves and buildings and in connection therewith to carry passengers and freights and collect charges therefor; (i) To acquire by lease or otherwise the assets, property, plant, machinery, undertaking, business, goodwill and stock in trade or services of any person or company carrying on any trade or business which this company is authorized to carry on, or similar or identical thereto or capable of being operated in conjunction therewith, to operate and to pay for the same in cash or in shares, bonds or other securities of this company, partly in cash and partly in stock, bonds or other securities of this company; (j) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and to own and hold the shares, bonds or other securities of any manufacturing or other corporation carrying on any business similar to that of the company, notwithstanding the provisions of section 44 of the said act; (k) To amalgamate with any other company having objects similar to or identical with those of the company and to obtain from any such other company, or companies, all or any of its rights, privileges and concessions which the company may think desirable to obtain and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions; (l) To draw, make, execute, endorse, discount, accept and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants and other negotiable and transferable instruments; (m) To lend money to customers and others having dealings with the company and to guarantee the performance of contracts by any such persons; (n) To remunerate any person, firm or company for services rendered or to be rendered in placing or assisting to place or guaranteeing the placing of any of the shares of the company's capital or any bonds or other securities of the company, or in or about the formation, promotion, organization or conduct of its business; (o) To pay all or any costs, charges or expenses preliminary or incidental to any of the purposes of the company, and everything necessary, suitable and convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein granted, or which shall at any time appear to be conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the company. 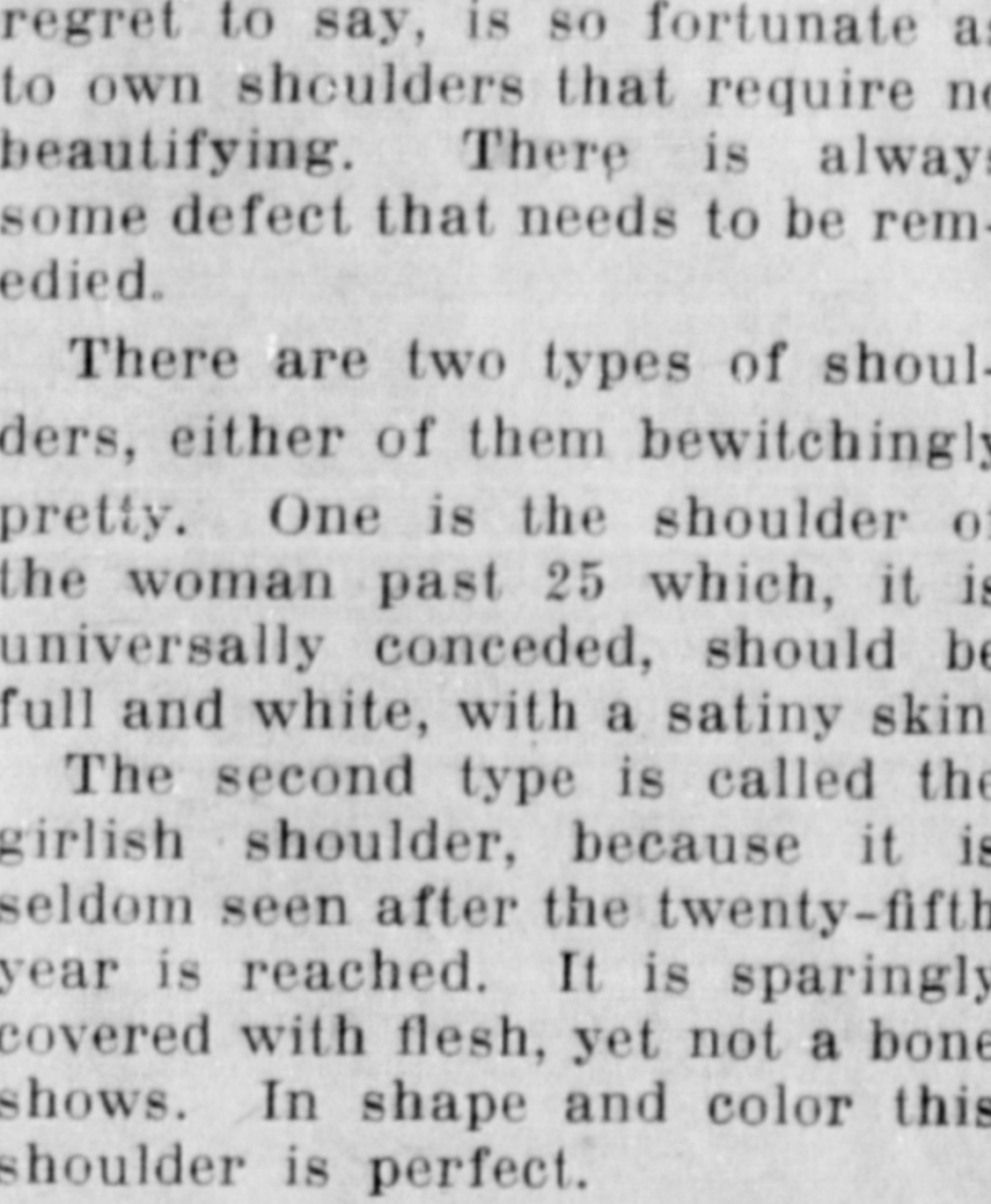

PERFECT SHOULDERS A Beauty No Woman Should Neglect Says Mrs. Norris. Not one woman in twenty, I regret to say, is so fortunate as to own shoulders that require no beautifying. There is always some defect that needs to be remedied. There are two types of shoulders, either of them bewitchingly pretty. One is the shoulder of the woman past 25 which, it is universally conceded, should be full and white, with a satiny skin. The second type is called the girlish shoulder, because it is seldom seen after the twenty-fifth year is reached. It is sparingly covered with flesh, yet not a bone shows. In shape and color this shoulder is perfect.



it rub it gently over the shoulders until they are well coated with the nourishing oil. The next step is to massage this emollient into the flesh, which is done by rubbing the skin very, very delicately with a rotary movement of the fingertips. This plumping massage should be given once every 24 hours, preferably at bedtime, and should extend over 20 minutes. I cannot promise rapid results, as flesh forms very slowly on the shoulders. Very plump shoulders are always more of a beauty defect than shoulders that are frail to a fault. I should strongly advise those troubled in this way to declare war upon the fatty cells. Make it your aim to break them down. How is this accomplished? Simply by kneading the flesh heavily with the fingertips. Every woman should have satin smooth shoulders, as rough-skinned shoulders are abnormal. Bear well in mind that your shoulders will not be smooth as the petals of a rose unless they are given a thorough scrubbing night and morning with a complexion brush and quantities of hot, latherly water. After you know that the skin is clean as clean can be spray the shoulders well with scented, very cold water. This will prove stimulating to the skin and help to make it soft and smooth. This beautifying treatment cannot be considered complete until a rough towel is see-sawed across the back and chest until every bit of moisture has been absorbed. Yellow shoulders are abnormal, banishing the saffron tints. What so we must contrive some way of for an astringent that will just fill your needs. Alum 60 grains Thick almond milk . . . 1 1/2 ounces Rose water 6 ounces Mix ingredients well and shake before applying to the skin. Nothing could be uglier to my mind than the shoulder that is dotted with pimples. While it is not a neasy matter to rid oneself of these blotches, yet can hope eventually to possess a smooth skin if you eat wisely and not too well. If you wish to hasten matters, and I suppose you do, you might treat the obnoxious pimples externally, giving them a sulphur steam bath every third day. This treatment is generally efficacious, causing face as well as shoulder pimples to take a speedy departure.
