VALUE OF AIR FORCE

Experts are saying that Poland was overrun because of the failure of her air force. The first few days of the war saw the destruction of the air bases, the airdromes, the landing fields and everything that goes with successful air service. The result was that there was none to dispute the mastery of Germany overhead and bombs rained on the unfortunate inhabitants spreading terror throughout the country.

So far on the western front the French and British have had the mastery in the air and this has given the Allies the advantage and enabled them to force the Germans back into their own country, even though the Allies have carefully avoided injuring civilians.

The Germans are now threatening a campaign of frightfulness such as proved successful in Poland. Only time will tell exactly what the effect of such a campaign may be but we are confident that our British and French defences may prove adequate to discourage the hellish designs of Hitler and his tribe.




