### WE DO NOT AGREE

Many of our readers do not agree with our views on many subjects. We do not expect them to do so. We agree to differ.

Only the very prejudiced people are willing to read or hear only one side of any question. They are so few in number that they do not count much in the circulation of a newspaper. We do not try to convert the people who differ from us but we know a great many of them like to read our views even if they do not agree with us. They sometimes tell us what they think and we like to hear from them.

### RAILWAY QUESTION

Throughout the country today there seems to be more discussion of the railway question than has been heard for some years. That is the result of the outspoken attitude of Senator Meighen, leader of the Conservative party in the Senate. He has thrown in his lot wholly with the unification idea. He explains that what he wants is not physical unification but unified management. If the management was inclined to favor the C.N.R., it would get the best of the game and, if the C.P.R. had the bulk of the management, the C.N.R. would quite possibly be neglected. Those who say this might look back and see how Prince Rupert has been treated.

If the Canadian National were to be sold, lock, stock and barrel, it would be nothing like as bad as unification. The most likely outcome of the transportation problem, if it is to be changed from the present system, is for the government to take over all means of transportation and thus settle the truck controversy.

We are told that, so long as trucks are to use the highways, practically free of charge with unrestricted hours of work, the railways cannot hope to compete with them. No government seems likely to try to stop this competition so the alternative is to buy them out and allow no more to operate, thus creating a state monopoly. We have mentioned this as a possible solution of the problem and as a better solution than unification.

### CREDIT STILL GOOD

Evidently the credit of British Columbia is still good. The Premier went east recently and, after interviewing the Ottawa government, went on to the financial centres. Then, within a very short time, it was announced that the minister of finance had arranged a loan in New York, one million of which will be expended on roads. Prince Rupert could use that million very well but, unfortunately, there are a hundred other places that need roads just as much as do we.

Cincinnati Reds, in National League, and New York Yankees in American, Back in Stride Again

PHILADELPHIA, June 8: (CP)—Cincinnati Reds retained a three-and-a-half game margin of leadership in the National League yesterday by defeating the Phillies here while the runner-up St. Louis Cardinals were downing the Brooklyn Dodgers at Ebbetts Field. Pittsburgh Pirates and Chicago Cubs won over Boston Bees and New York Giants respectively and remained tied in third place as the Brooklyn Dodgers dropped back into fifth position.

In the American League the New York Yankees defeated the White Sox at Chicago and their margin of leadership is now nine full games over the Boston Red Sox whose game with the St. Louis Browns was postponed on account of rain at St. Louis.
