PRETTY WELL SO FAR

The British government has done pretty well so far in keeping all of us out of war. Every move and apparently every thought has been to precent an armed conflict which would embroil most of the world. The thing is so awful to contemplate that it is no wonder world leaders have been worried and even those of us who know only what we read and hear have done our bit of worrying at times. Very few people in Canada want to see a war and very few people in England want war. We also believe that very few people in Germany or in Italy want war. The danger has been that the European leaders would involve their people by some rash act. We do not know that the governmentcontrolled newspapers of Germany and Italy have been saying some very nasty things about British public men and have been boasting of what they intend to do. This does not make for peace in spite of what anyone may say toba, as usual, leads in this work to the contrary. Both Hitler and Mussolini have been very provecative and only the forbearance of the British and French has prevented a collision. Mr. Chamberlain is said to be

taking a holiday in Scotland and yet we hardly think he has shut

himself wholly away from a restless world. He is never far away from the receiver of a telephone Cincinne or from a telegraph office which can reach him in a few minutes at the most. It is a terrible life to lead with the whole weight of an empire on his shoulders.

### BRITISH NOT JITTERY

We are told that Germany today has two million men under arms and that those recently called for manoeuvres have been retained under arms in case they should be needed.
