

# NORSE WERE HERE EARLY

James Curran Seeks To Prove Vikings First Settlers In North America

TORONTO, Sept. 6: (CP)—Vinland is the variously identified part of North America visited by the Norsemen perhaps 500 years before Columbus "discovered" the continent. Norse sailors ventured westward from Iceland to Greenland and then to the mainland.

From old Norse tales the belief has prevailed for hundreds of years that Vinland, the land of "self sown wheat" and "grapes," abundant fuel and great trees, must be Nova Scotia or the New country of his Algonquin district. It

England States or even Virginia so well do they fit the descriptions left by the Vikings.

In his book, "Here Was Vinland," James W. Curran, editor of the Sault Daily Star at Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, draws a fascinating conclusion that Vinland was the Great Lakes region of Canada and the United States. His theory is the Norsemen ventured into Ontario, Manitoba, North Dakota and elsewhere around the year 1000.

### Will Evoke Interest

"Here Was Vinland" may or may not be accepted by the experts but the results of Mr. Curran's painstaking search for evidence are certain to be read with interest by scholars and archaeologists no less than by people who will just want to know about the almost-legendary Norsemen.


Mr. Curran is already famous as the unofficial publicity man of the modest wolf that inhabits the bush and then to the mainland.
