EVERYTHING WONDERFUL Yesterday was not a wonderful day for the clouds were heavy and now and then a little drizzling rain fell, yet it delighted at least one newspaper woman from Los Angeles. She expressed herself as delighted with the climate, delighted with the gardens, enthralled by the wonderful color everywhere in the city. She exuded enthusiasm and saw beauty everywhere. Everything was wonderful.

And then half an hour later the opinion was expressed by a Prince Rupert resident that the climate was "rotten," the gardens this year were decidedly "off color" and it was about the worst summer the city had had since it became a city thirty years ago. 
