Whifflets From The Waterfront

Big Freighter Completes Temporary Repairs Here And Is Resuming Voyage—Improvements To Alberni—Naval Men From Calgary.

E. M. Murphy, underwriters' representative from Seattle in connection with the docking of the freighter Mary D., which received temporary repairs at the local dry dock during the latter part of this week following a stranding in Grenville Channel, sails by the Princess Norah this afternoon on his return south. The Mary D. went off the pontoons yesterday morning and is now reloading some of the cargo which it was necessary to take off prior to docking. This afternoon she will leave in resumption of her interrupted voyage to the Seward district in western Alaska.

Lighthouse tender Alberni is now at the local dry dock where her after deck is being closed in. The work, it is estimated, will take about a week's time.

Union steamer Catala, Capt. James Findlay, arrived in port at 9:15 last night from Vancouver and waypoints and sailed at midnight for Stewart and other northern points whence she will return here tomorrow afternoon southbound.

A white light, automatically flashed at short intervals, has been established at Cumming Point, Gribbell Island, Wright Sound. With elevation of sixteen feet, the structure is a concrete base surmounted by a white slatwork triangle with lantern on top. The light is unwatched.

Three ratings of the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve from Calgary arrived in the city on the Catala last night from the south to take up duty as signallers with the new port examination service which has been established at Prince Rupert.

After having spent the better part of the night here discharging a large consignment of fish from Ketchikan for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways, Northland Transportation Co.'s motorship liner Northland, Capt. Len Williams, sailed at 6 o'clock yesterday morning in continuation of her voyage to Seattle.
