UNCLE SAM GETTING SORE

United States Making Plans to Decrease the Large Emigration to Western Canada from the Western States.

Washington, D. C., March 4.—With the co-operation of more than twenty-five states the federal authorities have entered upon a systematic campaign to prevent the emigration of persons from the United States to Canada. It is estimated that 7,500 farmers went to Northwest Canada between July 1, 1910, and July 1, 1911, and hundreds of thousands before that time. To divert emigration to different parts of the United States the department of commerce is co-operating with the state departments of agriculture and bureaus of immigration.

To this end the governors of these states have been asked for information on the following points:
"Are there any public lands such as government, state or school lands open to settlement in your state? If so, state their extent, and how they may be procured, the principal products and resources, the physical characteristics and the climate."

Shortest Route.

The authorized mileage of the Grand Trunk Pacific main line and branches is 11,500 miles, of which 1,745 miles are between Winnipeg and Prince Rupert, 1,800 miles are under contract by the Transcontinental Railway Commission, between Winnipeg and Moncton. At the completion of this national railway the trip around the world will be shortened by one week, as Europe will be brought closer to Asia, and as the maximum grade of the Grand Trunk Pacific is 1-3 of the next best transcontinental railway on the continent, time between the Atlantic and the Pacific will be annihilated when the service is in operation.

Manitoba Member Declares People of East Are Retarding Development of West and Dominion Should Be Divided.

Winnipeg, March 4.—Western Canada was stirred today by the declaration in the Manitoba legislature of William Molloy, a Liberal member from Le Verandry, that he would support a resolution looking to the separation of Western Canada from the eastern part of the Dominion, which he charged with injuring and showing hostility for the western section by its defeat of American reciprocity.

"No greater blow," said the member, "has every been dealt Western Canada than the rejection of reciprocity."

"The people of Eastern Canada deliberately have set themselves to injure Western Canada, and in the course of ten years there will be such an agitation in Western Canada against their binding acts that nothing but separation will suffice."

His remarks were loudly applauded among Liberal members.

BANKER VISITS PRINCE RUPERT

Immediately Decides to Invest in Local Real Estate—Weather Here Supreme, He Says.

Captain Robinson, accompanied by Mrs. Robinson, was among the passengers for the south on the last trip of the George. Captain Robinson is the vice president of the Royal Crown Bank and is the owner of a large department store in Selkirk. His home is in Winnipeg. Captain and Mrs. Robinson came to Rupert on a pleasure trip, but he expressed himself so favorably impressed with the city and its ideal climate that he at once decided to make some investments in real estate, negotiations for which are being carried on through a local agency.

WARM FIGHT FOR NELSON

Liberals to Have a Standard Bearer with Confidence of Placing the Riding Again in Liberal Column.

Nelson, B. C., March 5.—Although the nominating convention has not been announced, Nelson Liberals, according to the leaders of the party, will have a standard bearer in the field against the Conservative who will be nominated Wednesday night. Greatest confidence is expressed that Nelson will again be placed in the Liberal column. The Conservatives are equally confident of victory.

There are several candidates for nomination, among whom the most active are Fred A. Starkey, president of Associated Boards of Trade; William R. MacLean and Harry Wright, present member. A hot fight is promised at the convention and in certain eventualities independent Conservatives may take the field.
