HYDRO-ELECTRIC BYLAW Words of the Validation Act in Reply to Several Enquiries. Several enquiries have recently reached us in regard to the validation by the legislature of the hydro electric bylaw. Its passage was reported at the time, but we here give the information asked for. The bill passed its third reading on February 21st and was signed by the lieutenant governor in council on February 27th.

In the preamble it recites that some doubt exists as to the validity of the bylaw on the alleged ground that it dealt with two subject matters, but a petition from the City Council of Prince Rupert having been presented it was expedient to grant the prayer of the petition, the validation clause reading: "The said bylaw, known as bylaw No. 59 of the City of Prince Rupert, to provide for the construction of a hydro electric system to supply said city with water, electric light and power, and to create and secure a debt for the purpose of constructing the said system amounting to \$550,000," is hereby declared to be valid and binding, and the debentures issued or to be issued thereunder to be valid and binding securities, notwithstanding the said alleged defect."
