He said he hoped he would be able to say that no word he used against any person would prevent him receiving the co-operation of every. person after the election. He later made it clear that this remark should not be construed as an indication that he had any intention of forming a coalition government. Mr. King warned that "bitter and contemptible" words of National government advocates would not make for unity and declared that no word uttered by him in the campaign would alienate any man or woman of any political
