



The body of Mrs. Crerar, fourth victim of the tragedy, arrived on last night's train from the interior and is at present at the parlors of the B. C. Undertakers.

## Timely Recipes

**STUFFED VEGETABLE MARROW**  
Cut a medium sized marrow in half, lengthwise. Pare and remove the seeds. Cook the halves in boiling water for ten minutes and drain. Fill with following stuffing:  
1 cup finely chopped ham or left-over meat, 2 cups medium cream sauce, 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper, salt and pepper.  
Place the marrow on a well greased baking shell. Cover the filling with buttered crumbs and bake for 20 minutes in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F. Delicious supper dish serving 6 to 8.

He was of that school of railway men who began an active career at an early age and progressed throughout his service. He entered service with the Grand Trunk Railway at Toronto in August, 1892, as clerk in the superintendent's office and, in the years that followed, served in various branches of the freight traffic department in several sections of the Dominion. Steadily rising in the ranks he took over the duties of general freight traffic manager for the Canadian National system, including Grand Trunk lines in the United States, in March, 1939.
