Motor Torpedo Boats . . .

Before the war started Italy had a fleet of very fast motor torpedo boats. Where are they and what have they done? Germany has a number of them and so has Britain. We do not hear that they had done any outstanding effective work. In British Columbia the Financial News is asking why British Columbia does not have a fleet of these boats. It may be that they have not been able to do much in other waters so are not recommended for the Pacific Coast, especially in view of the weather conditions here in the winter.

War planes are quite different. They have shown their effectiveness in attacks and defence and never a day passes but what we hear of their work. That seems to be what we need on the Pacific—a thousand or more war planes, bombers and fighters.

Another Bubble Pricked . . .

As long as Mussolini was able to strut and pose and boast but not act everything went well. His people seemed to be satisfied, even if they did get gradually less wages and a poorer standard of living. He seemed to think all he had to do to frighten the Greeks back and make them throw down their arms was for his crack troops to start marching in from Albania. But the Greeks evidently did not fall down and worship the noble Roman. They actually had the courage to resist and today they have practically driven the Italians out of Greece, killing many Italians and taking many prisoners. So another bubble has been pricked.

The Topic Of Conversation . . .

Listening in to conversations in a hall in which there were perhaps twenty little groups of diners, it was noticed that almost every table was discussing the war. Most of the men were well posted on the progress of the great struggle and most of them had individual ideas on what was being done, what should be done or what was about to be done. Of course all felt there was only one possible winner. Extreme confidence in the British forces pervaded the whole. That same spirit may be said to be general throughout most of Canada if newspapers and travellers are to be believed.

Beautiful Optimism . . .

A book that was published two years ago by Bertha Damon recounting the life of a New England grandmother and granddaughters proved to be one of the most interesting books read in many a day not only in giving an insight into the mentality and life of some of the New England people of a past age but also because of its delightful spirit of optimism, something needed badly just now. Just two quotations from the conversation of an old lady of ninety might prove interesting to those who wish to get away from the harrowing details of the war. Grandma is speaking:

"I am glad that spring has come and I can work in the garden and be in it but I am sincerely sorry the winter is over. It was such a delightful winter—unusual ice storms to enjoy, just like Paradise.

"I constantly marvel at the goodness of the creator. He always provides us with birds or leaves, weather or seasons or times of day to keep us companied and entertained. My friends are almost all taken now, but just living is so delightful, so absorbing that if I were—I hope this doesn't sound hard or inhumane; I don't mean it in any such way—if I were the last person left alone on the earth, I should still be happy."
