"The provincial legislatures should have exclusive jurisdiction to prescribe the statutory conditions and inc ants of insurance contracts and exclusive jurisdiction to license insurance agents. brokers and adjusters," said the report. "They should also have power to supervise the financial affairs of all insurance companies incorporated and operating solely within the province of incorporation; but a province should be enabled to delegate this function to the Dominion if it so desires
