Handicrafts Of Canada Shown At Lunch Yesterday

Mademoiselle Gaultier de Verendrye Makes Plea for Revival of Handicrafts, Especially Those Of Own Country

People take too little interest in their own country and in things of their own country and in things of Mademoiselle Gaultier de la Verendrye speaking to the Prince Rupert Rotary Club at its luncheon yesterday afternoon. In Canada were executed the finest handicrafts in the world. These handicrafts should be shown at the exhibitions more prominently than cans of fish, desirable as the latter were. She said that Canadian exhibits had been dubbed "tin can exhibitions."

Miss Gaultier took a great interest in the Indians and Eskimos of western Canada. She felt they should be encouraged to keep up their old arts and crafts, from which there was much to be learned. She said she had turned her own home in Quebec into a handicraft centre where she was trying to increase the interests in the handicrafts of Canada. The handicrafts were also being returned to France from whence they came with the result that today the French people were spinning and weaving with Canadian flax and wool. In Quebec province 30,000 habitants were spinning by hand and weaving on their own looms wonderful fabrics. When they weave they sing. Weaving and singing naturally go together. Without song the people can't work.

The Acadians were different people from the habitants, coming from the chateau country of France. That was where the true French was spoken. Parisians spoke poor French.

One of her missions on this tour, Miss Gaultier said, was to urge the people of the country to forget differences of race and religion and to make of Canada one country. She pointed to what was being done in Europe in bringing France and Britain together as an example of what should be done in Canada.

The visitor also put in a plea for the natives of British Columbia and the preservation of their traditional art. She had visited the local museum and found some good exhibits of native art but it was spoiled by the introduction of other outside arts. Some of the exhibits were not Canadian.

A number of hats were shown the members of the club of habitant or Acadian design, designs which were brought from France originally. Some of the hats were so tiny and so complicated that it took several days to iron one. These were mostly linen although silk was used for ties of those worn by the nobility. There were hundreds of pleats and the ironing was done on the hand and wheat straws were used in the process. Miss Gaultier spoke facetiously of some of the modern women who had nothing on their heads and nothing in their heads.

RELIEF IS DOMINION FUNCTION

government which can use these instruments effectively.

Existing Set-Up

Under the existing set-up, relief standards have varied widely and have tended to be "those of poor relief, rather than for the maintenance of the efficiency of employables."

To facilitate handling relief for employables, and to protect the principle of freedom of trade between provinces, the Dominion should have jurisdiction to establish basic minimum wages and maximum hours of labor and to give the age of employment, but leaving to any province the right to raise minimum wages, lower hours or raise the age of employment if it wished.

In the case of aid for primary industries, the commission urged that the Dominion should make advances and collections itself, if need should ever arise for it to advance operating costs to an industry as it did for prairie agriculture. "Very serious abuses and wastes," the commission commented.

The provinces, under the commission's recommendations, would retain responsibility for unemployable unemployed as they have always had. The financial plan would enable the provincial governments to lighten the load of the municipalities in this regard.

Social Insurance

The commission divided the jurisdiction in social insurance. Unemployment insurance and contributory old age pension were "inherently of a national character" while health insurance and workmen's compensation were not. Regional differences militated against a national health scheme. The commission was impressed by the inadequacy of health services, rather than any overlapping.

Even if the Dominion did not take over complete responsibility for employable unemployed, the commission urged that the Dominion alone should have jurisdiction over unemployment insurance.

Because of the possibility of various changes in circumstances, the commission advised against rigidity in jurisdiction, suggesting that concurrent jurisdiction in social insurance was the simplest method. This would enable the Dominion and provinces to adjust their respective responsibilities over social insurance periodically to meet changing conditions.

Old age pension costs were likely to double in 30 years, apart from changing the age limit or pension rates. So it was possible Canada might decide to follow the example of various other countries by instituting a compulsory contributory plan. If so, it would have to operate on a national basis for efficiency.

were made to the commission urging Dominion aid for education. The commission held it would not be wise or appropriate for the Dominion to make grants to the provinces earmarked for the support of general education.

Its financial proposals aimed at placing every province in a position to discharge its responsibilities regarding education. The commission recognized that education was a matter of provincial jurisdiction under the British North America Act.

On the question of minority claims to separate schools, the commission commented that the representations "indicate the existence in several provinces of a sense of grievance which may well contribute to national disunity as well as to lack of harmony within the province concerned." However, no recommendation was made as the matter was held not to fall within the commission's authority.

Because of the importance of the efficient functioning of universities in all regions if some equality of influence in the national life is to be maintained between these regions," the commission suggested the possibilities of Dominion grants to provincial universities, contingent on maintenance of the provincial grants and preservation of high academic standards.

Such grants could be distributed on a population basis, to be spent at the discretion of the universities, perhaps for scholarships and bursaries.

Marketing Legislation

Twenty years of constitutional confusion in the marketing field might be solved by the creation of concurrent jurisdiction of Dominion and provinces over the grad-

ing and marketing of a specified list of products, analogous to the provision of Section 95 of the British North America Act, said the report. This list might be added to by any of the provinces when they saw fit.

The whole complex of regulation of marketing would be greatly simplified, however, if constitutional provision were made for the provinces delegating powers to the Dominion, and vice versa.

A clear-cut division of functions throughout the whole field of insurance law was recommended, to bring to an end constitutional battles over insurance jurisdiction.

"The provincial legislatures should have exclusive jurisdiction to prescribe the statutory conditions and incidents of insurance contracts and exclusive jurisdiction to license insurance agents, brokers and adjusters," said the report. "They should also have power to supervise the financial affairs of all insurance companies incorporated and operating solely within the province of incorporation; but a province should be enabled to delegate this function to the Dominion if it so desires."
