**BRITAIN'S DESERT ARMIES REINFORCED BY EMPIRE AND ALLIES**



Reinforced by detachments from many parts of the Empire and from countries whose sovereign territory has been over-run by Germany, the British armies in the Near East are ready and waiting for any Axis drive at the Suez or the oilfields of Palestine and Iraq. These pictures show some of the desert fighters. At top left is a French pilot attached to the Middle East command of the R.A.F. ready to take off in his Morane Saulnier fighter, a machine which he flew to join the British forces when his country's resistance collapsed. At right a detachment of Polish motorcycle troops are shown in Palestine. The trim, sturdy soldiers shown below are part of a Gold Coast unit now stationed in Kenya colony. They are sturdy and dependable fighters, particularly at home in desert warfare.
