## JAP MENACE ON PACIFIC

Unprotected Coast of British Columbia Becomes a Subject of Consideration.  
**IF JAPAN SHOULD RESENT**  
British Navy Unable to Protect This Coast as Fleet is Required at Home.

Newcastle, Eng., March 10.—Speaking here the other day, Earl Percy, former under secretary for foreign affairs, discussed Japanese supremacy in the Pacific, saying that the position was a delicate one for Japanese immigration had been restricted by the United States and our own overseas dominions, which Japan might resent. Therefore, the defensive resources of the empire should be co-ordinated. If we had not fleet units on the Canadian Pacific coast, Canada, if attacked by the Japanese, could only be saved by the United States, for the German menace made us unable to do anything in the Pacific. The British line of battle was required in home waters.

**Confessed Dynamiter Slowly Sinking of Tuberculosis.**

Los Angeles, March 10.—That J. B. McNamara, confessed dynamiter of the Times building, will serve his life sentence in San Quentin in a brief time, is the belief of Malcolm McLaren, special Burns agent, who reports that the prisoner is slowly dying of tuberculosis. The detective saw him the other day and says that McNamara, light when sentenced, has lost fifteen pounds.
