NAZISM IS EVIL FORCE

Rev. A. Harding Priest Gives Eloquent Address at Weekly Rotary Luncheon

An eloquent address was given yesterday to the members of the Prince Rupert Rotary Club and visitors by Rev. A. Harding Priest, western field secretary of the Board of Religious Education of the Anglican Church. Mr. Priest showed that Nazism was an outstanding phase of the force of evil that was found to be a greater or lesser degree all over the world. Hitler had taken possession of the education system of Germany and perverted it so that there was growing up today in that country a race of young men who knew little or nothing of what they owed to the past. The new world order which it is attempted to set up was a terrible challenge. It contained all the sinister forces of evil.

The speaker explained that Hitler set up a standard of human conduct which was a complete reversal of those ethical, religious and moral precepts which other nations held dear. Today the tiniest tots in Germany were bent to one end by Nazi propaganda and their actions were quite logical in the light of their creed. Hitler had tried to prove that there was no ideal which could not be set aside by the use of violence and propaganda.

Mr. Priest quoted to show that the Biblical God was disgusting to national Socialism. Hitler was said to be greater than Jesus Christ. He gave it as his opinion that the Christian Church, both Lutheran and Roman Catholic, was the greatest barrier to Nazism in the world today.

Unfortunately, said the speaker, there seemed to be the same kind of people in this country and in the United States as those who were responsible for the condition in Germany. This was undermining the continent.

Mr. Priest spoke of the pathetic and fallacious doctrine of Karl Marx and the fact that this was the supreme hour of crisis in the conflict between evil and good. He urged the solidarity of the past with the present. In explaining why France fell, Marshal Petain had said that the spirit of ease had prevailed over that of sacrifice.

"How can I pay my debt to the past?" inquired Mr. Priest. "I can do it only with my actions today. My constant thought must be 'How can I help Britain today?' Those who really serve expect nothing in return. Despite one hundred dictators I must proclaim my belief in the work of the divine architect of the universe. As a mother said to her son when she recently went to live at Dover—'You do the fighting and let God do the worrying.'"

VANDERHOOF SHE TELLS OF LONDON

Former Local Nurse On Staff Of County Hospital Which Was Recently Bombed

Miss Phyllis M. Mooney R. N., formerly operating room supervisor of the Prince Rupert General Hospital, is now a member of the staff of a London County Council Hospital at New Southgate on which three bombs were recently dropped by German raiders, killing twenty patients as well as a young nurse eighteen years of age and badly injuring two others. Three bombs were dropped, Miss Mooney says in writing to a local friend. The first caused the casualties. The second was a miss and landed in a cabbage patch. The third was also a miss but shattered the nurses' residence badly although none were injured. Had it been a direct hit the consequences might have been much more serious as only a few nurses were off duty and in their rooms. The time was 1:45 on a Sunday afternoon. A huge crater was made in the ground between the nurses' residence and nurses' mess-room. Miss Mooney herself was in the nurses' messroom having lunch. All of a sudden debris came flying through the windows into the messroom and there was a scramble to get outside as it was feared the building would fall.

Miss Mooney tells of making a trip to downtown London to see the bombed places. "The state of London is not bad at all," she writes. "I think it is amazing how much of London still stands. Reports one hears do exaggerate the damage so. Of course, it is true there has been damage but, really, it is a few houses down here and there." Casualties are also fewer than one might be led to believe, says Miss Mooney.
