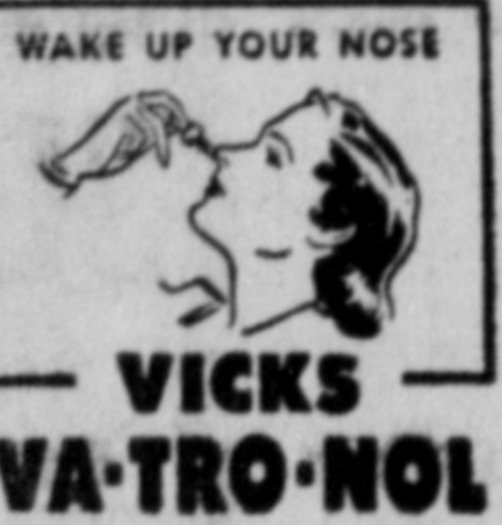
Miss Jean Dalzell is sailing tonight on the Prince Rupert for a holiday trip to Vancouver.
