## 'WANKLES' WON'T WIN

Army's Spokesman Points Out Rumor Mongers Don't Win Wars

MELBOURNE, August 2: (CP)—Those folks they call fifth column gossips in Canada and chatter-boxes in Britain are just plain "wankles" in Australia.

Capt. George Sutton, an officer of the Australian Imperial Force in addressing the people of Australia on behalf of the army said: "Don't qualify for the club which that gifted Australian artist created—the Wankles Club. Armstrong shows us that a Wankle is a gloomy soul with weak knees and a tendency to take the knock-out every time his opponent scores a light tap. Wankles won't win wars. "It lies in the power of the people to quench quickly the activities of the filthy fifth column. Do not repeat reports of doubtful accuracy and don't be Wankle."

Capt. Sutton warned: "The active 'fifth columnist'—the real enemy agent who is working hard in our midst today—issues the false statement, the half-truth, the lie, or the vivid distortion of fact."

"Don't belittle the efforts of your own people and praise the acts of your enemies, as so many foolish people do whenever they have the opportunity. A second's thought will save a lifetime or despair. Rumors can sink a battleship or destroy a nation's morale."

"Another way in which to help is to be cheerful. When bad news comes, as sometimes it must, treat it seriously but smile and carry on stronger than ever. We'll win the last round. Don't go around with gloomy faces."

### Timely Recipes

#### BROILED CHICKEN

Select broilers weighing 1½ to 2 pounds. Split down the back, clean and sprinkle with salt. Pre-heat broiler rack for 10 minutes. Place broilers, skin side down, on greased broiler rack, about 3 inches from heat. Brush with butter and broil 15 to 20 minutes. Turn. Brush skin side with butter and broil about 15 minutes longer or until birds are nicely browned and tender.
