**CAROL CAPITULATES**  
BUCHAREST—King Carol is stated to have finally capitulated to Germany's demand that territorial concessions be made by Romania to Hungary and Rumania. Negotiation of the claims are expected to start next week.

**JAPAN AND BRITAIN**  
LONDON—Official quarters here expect relations with Japan to become gradually worse, probably going to the brink of war but possibly not beyond because of Japanese fear that United States would come in. Germany blamed in official British circles for the deterioration of relations between Britain and Japan.

**BERLIN ALARMED**  
BERLIN—Anti-Aircraft guns from the roof of the German Foreign Office went into action today when an unidentified plane passed over. It was said later to have been a German plane which became detached from a squadron and lost its way.

**TO SHOW HE IS FIT**  
STOCKTON, Australia, Aug. 2:—To impress the military authorities with his physical fitness, Hunt intends to paddle from Newcastle to Sydney over 100 miles open ocean, in a canoe he has enlisted but was rejected for overseas service.

# NOT GOING INTO WAR

Improved Relations Between Russia and Germany Claimed by Molotoff

MOSCOW, Aug. 2: (CP)—Foreign Commissar - Premier Vyacheslav Molotoff told the Russian Parliament yesterday that Russia was not taking part in the war.

Molotoff said that recent events, including the collapse of France, had only served to improve Russia's relations with Germany and Italy.

It was possible, Molotoff suggested, that, as a result of the appointment of Sir Stafford Cripps as ambassador to the Soviet, relations between Russia and Great Britain might improve. Molotoff suggested the European war might soon enter a new phase with United States entering on the side of Great Britain against Germany and Italy.


