CHURCHILL'S OPTIMISM

The optimism of Prime Minister Winston Churchill is an optimism based on realism. He is not afraid to face facts. He tells the British people that Germany still has more airplanes than have the British and yet he sees the British winning and carrying the fight right into the heart of Germany. He also says that British defences are much stronger than ever they have been before. Mr. Churchill said that the British had not yet reached the summit of the hill. They were still in the midst of a tremendous struggle. Just now they were bending all their energies to defending their country and carrying the war into Germany and Italy.

There was never a suggestion or a doubt as to the eventual victory of the British but there was an appeal to those who were able to do so to fill in some of the gaps which might occur in the defences. He also visualized the future independence and prosperity of France when, with the help of General De Gaulle and his army, the country will have been freed from the present thraldom.
