His Lordship Back Today After Trip to Aiyansh, Greenville and Kincolith

Rt. Rev. G. A. Rix, Bishop of Caledonia, returned to Prince Rupert on the Catala today following a visit to Aiyansh, Greenville, Kincolith and other Naas River points on ecclesiastical duties.

Bishop Rix arrived at Kincolith Sunday afternoon from Aiyansh and Greenville. The committee of Christ Church tendered a banquet to the Bishop on his arrival at Kincolith. There was an address of welcome to His Lordship on behalf of the community and a farewell address was given to the mission, Rev. Oliver Thorne. The Kincolith Concert Band played the marches "Over the Top to Victory" and "Trombones on Parade" and the overture "Orpheus." The Bishop conducted evening service at Kincolith.

GERMAN DRIVE

menced with the penetration through Luxembourg and eastern Belgium.

A report in London last night said that Hitler's forces in Belgium in the vicinity of Ghent had been repeatedly beaten off with the Belgians playing an important part in the fighting there. The situation was "no better and no worse" and it was admitted that there must be a decision within forty-eight hours. It was suggested at that time that the German attack was "bogging down."

Counter-Offensive Due

A general counter-offensive by the Allied armies must now come and indications are not lacking that it is on the way. The Allied retreats so far, extensive as they may seem and serious as the situation may today appear, have, undoubtedly, been to a large extent strategic with a view to conserving strength for a general consolidation. The Germans have paid dearly in men and fighting equipment for all ground they have so far gained while Allied losses have been relatively light.

Well informed quarters today denied German claims that General Henri Giraud, commander of the Ninth French Army, and his staff had been captured.

More Confused Than Ever

An authoritative spokesman in London said today that the battle on the western front was "more confused than ever with everybody behind everybody else's lines." He said that German communique claims that Abbeville, fifteen miles from the English Channel had been captured, were grossly exaggerated. Later, however, a French spokesman said tonight that small detachments of German motor-cycle troops had penetrated the outskirts of Abbeville region.

The French evacuated Laon, fifteen miles south of La Fere, the town being occupied by the Germans without fighting, it was disclosed today. Fighting continued east of Cambrai and near St. Quentin and Peronne as the German drive westward continued at a slower pace. All German efforts to cross the Aisne River have been repulsed. A French War Office spokesman disclosed for the first time that German parachute troops were being used in the present operations. German advance units consist of light motorized columns supported by planes.
