



# CRUSADERS

Fighters of 47 Nations Enrolled Under Tricolor in Cause in Which They Believe

PARIS, May 31: (CP)-Every nationality from irakians to Uruguayans, from citizens of the United States to denationalized bearers of League of Nations passports are to be found in the ranks of the legions of France. The French uniform may cover a Yugoslav, Dane, Swede, Norwegian, Belgian, Peruvian or Egyptian.

The other day an White Russian resident of Paris and second lieutenant in the French army received the Legion of Horofor gallantry. This suggested an investigation which revealed that no less than 47 different nationalities are serving under the Tricolor of France.


The legions of Polish and Czechoslovak soldiers have reached such proportions that they are well known. They are independent organizations in France but take their place side by side with the Alilied armies at the Front. Less known are the international volunteers.

These strangers of many lands locked to recruiting offices in France when the war began and they are incorporated in newly formed foreign regiments. Many of them scarcely know enough of the French language to understand the orders given them. To them there is no national sentiment, or very little, but they are fighting for "purely ideological reasons."
