An analysis of the vote seems to, indicate that, if all the dissident Conservatives had voted, they would have defeated the government. There were 151 Conservatives who did not vote but some of these were! on active service and could not be present. The others abstained because, while they could not agree with the government, they did not wish to definitely turn out the party and possibly precipitate an election.

A younger man at the helm seems to be the desire of British people everywhere, including Canadians. While most of us admire Mr. Chamberlain we feel that he has not always been a success. Some even think he is a rank failure. One of the difficulties is choosing a successor who might be acceptable to all. Pretty soon there may be a call! for Eden to head the government unless the situation! changes.

GETTING MORE SHIPS

An occasional American ship is sold to French or British interests and the registry changed to: British or French. This enables the ships to be used for! carrying war supplies. On the whole! the number of British ships in service today is said to be as large as when the war started.
