French repulsing successfully such atacks as were vainly launched by was calm while on the Aisne there was light artillery contact. East of the Moselle there was also light activity today.

There was artillery action at numerous points in the Moselle and Vosges areas yesterday and heavy combat on the Aisne River then.

French troops Saturday smashed their way across the lower Somme River, establishing themselves at a bridgehead which they held against repeated German counter-attacks. The point where the bridgehead was established was not disclosed but it was presumed to be in the Abbeville sector where the Germans were said to have been dislodged from the south bank of the river. French reconnaissance planes were also active.
