This should make it nossible for Canada to properly outfit all her fighting forces and allow sufficient material for the usual civilian supply but the prices are high and that should keep down the civilian demand.

### ECONOMIC PRESSURE

Britain is bringing economic pressure to bear on a number of neutral countries to prevent them supplying Germany with goods which are necessary to the successful carrying on of the war. Some of them had been pass-1ing goods through their countries to Germany and thus! enabling her to evade the blockade. Naturally, these countries had to protest and show Germany they were being forced to stop supplying her.
