## HALIBUT LANDINGS AWAY UP

Arrivals This May More Than Million Pounds In Excess Of Last

Prince Rupert halibut landings for the month of May this year, according to figures compiled on the local waterfront, amounted to 1,730,500 pounds as compared with 2,667,500 pounds in May 1939 and 2,155,000 pounds in May 1938. The Canadian landings for this May were 1,441,500 pounds in comparison with 1,265,500 pounds in May 1939 and 1,004,500 pounds in May 1938. The American landings for May this year were 2,289,000 pounds as against 1,402,000 pounds in May 1939 and 1,150,500 pounds in May 1938. Landings for April this year at

Prince Rupert were placed at a total of 2,620,000 pounds in comparison with 2,177,500 pounds last year, the Canadian April total being 1,180,000 pounds as against 892,000 pounds and the American 1,440,000 pounds as against 1,285,000 pounds.
