Timely Recipes

1 cup sifted cake flour
1/4 cup sifted sugar
1 cup egg whites
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 teaspoon orange extract
1 egg yolks, beaten until thick and lemon-colored

Sift flour once, measure, add 3/4 cup sugar and sift four times. Beat egg whites and salt with flat wire whisk. When foamy, add cream of tartar; continue beating until stiff enough to hold up in peaks, but not dry. Beat in remaining sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time. Sift flour over mixture in small amounts, folding carefully. Divide in two parts. To one, fold in vanilla. To other, fold in orange extract and egg yolks. Put 2 tablespoons into ungreased level food pan, alternating the layers. Bake in slow oven (25 degrees F.); after 30 minutes decrease heat slightly to 350 degrees F., bake 50 minutes longer. Put on rack until cake is cold.

On his way home to France to take up military service for his country as a poilu, Father Louis Delarue, who has been parish priest at Whitehorse, Yukon Territory, for the past year and a half, passed through the city on the Princess Louise yesterday afternoon enroute to Vancouver whence he will proceed to the Atlantic Coast to embark for the Old Country. Father Delarue has been in this country for the past three years and for a time was in Prince Rupert before proceeding to the Yukon.
