LONDON, May 22: (CP)— Swift Allied counter blows on land and in the air against the German mechanized forces in the Abbeville region have averted for the present completion of the threatened Nazi line to the English Channel, which would pen in the British army, a spokesman declared tonight.

At Paris a War Ministry spokesman told the press there had been hardly any change along the front in the last 48 hours and General Weygand is "really satisfied" with the situation.

A British spokesman said the Allied military position shows a slight improvement for the first time after five days. The Royal Air Force is still making large scale bombing attacks.
