

ARMY LIFE IS FILMED

Comedy Drama Of Training Days Is "The Fighting 69th" Now At Capitol Theatre

The ups and downs of army training camp life are depicted in a humorously treated human interest drama "The Fighting 69th," featuring James Cagney, George Brent and Pat O'Brien, which comes to the screen of the Capitol Theatre here for the first half of this week.

Cagney, as the tough guy who stubbornly resists falling into line with military rules and regulations, provides the main thread of the story. In spite of the efforts of O'Brien as the friendly and humane priest, and Brent as a hard-bitten but understanding colonel, he refuses to conform until events place him in a position where there is a true test of his mettle and he comes through with flying colors.

In addition to the action drama, there is a good leavening of broad comedy much of which is carried on between Cagney and Alan Hale with a typical feud between a cocky private and a bullying top sergeant which climaxes in one of the most rough and tumble fist fights ever filmed.

The cast also includes Jeffrey Lynn, Frank McHugh, Dennis Morgan, Dick Foren, William Lundigan and Guinn Williams.
