EDITORIAL

STANDING AT OTTAWA

Even if all the C.C.F. candidates were elected there would not be enough members of that faith to form a government. Possibly, not more than one in ten will make the grade so they can be nothing but a hopeless minority, no matter how well meaning they may be. Should the Conservative be elected he would join the ranks of His Majesty's loyal opposition. Either would be without standing or influence in the House of Commons. On the other side, Olof Hanson has for several years been doing the ground work of political life at the capital. He is known and respected. He takes a strictly non-partisan view of public questions. He represents every party and group and looks after their interests if they have what he considers a just cause. Why even think of changing candidates?

COMMENDABLE ATTITUDE

We like the attitude of George Weaver, C.C.F. candidate in the election here. He discusses public questions in a reasonable and moderate manner. While we do not agree with his policy, particularly that theoretical policy dealing with the taking over of everything by the government, we agree with much of the program for it is just an ordinary liberal policy.

The Conservative candidate is also exemplary in his electioneering. Skeena is fortunate in having men of such calibre representing the different political groups. If the campaign carries on as at present, all will be able to clasp hands at the end and congratulate the winner. After all, it is just the shareholders in Canada's biggest business electing directors to carry on for the next four or five years.

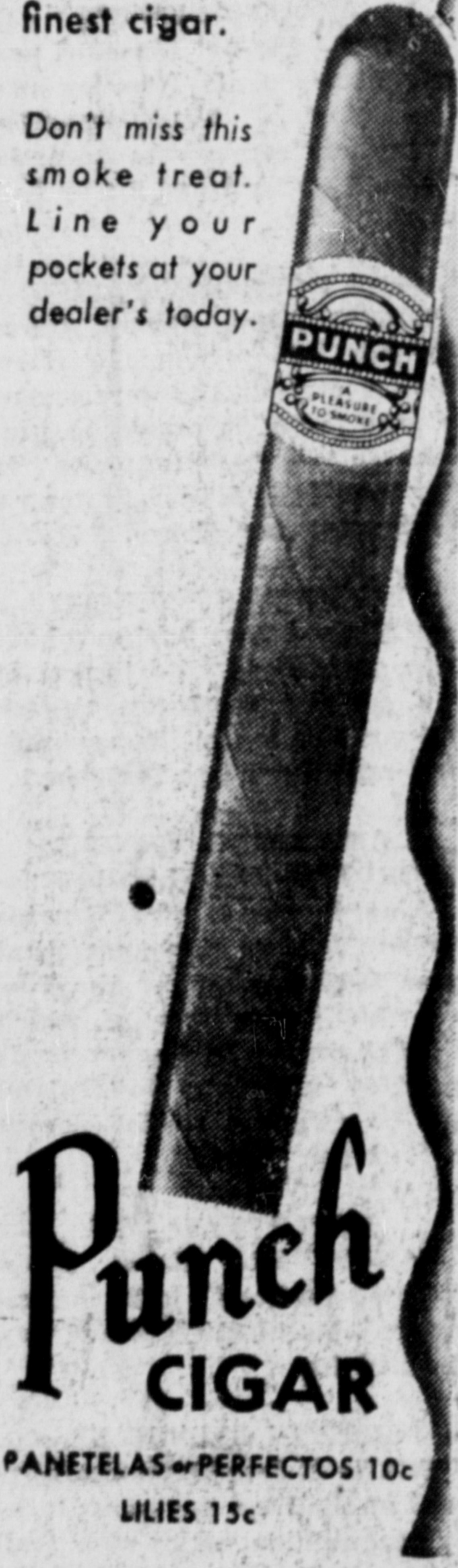
