THREE CANDIDATES

There are now three candidates in the field from which the electors of Skeena will select one to represent them at Ottawa. The first in the field was George Weaver of Nanaimo, a very estimable gentleman who once before contested this constituency in the provincial arena but was defeated. He is the representative of the Socialist group known as the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation. He is pledged to support a Socialist program.

The most recent nomination is that of George F. Cameron, Conservative, a Vancouver barrister, who has a claim to local interest in that his father was temporarily in Prince Rupert as Presbyterian minister. We are told that he is a very suitable person to represent Skeena in the Federal Parliament. He would support Dr. Manion.

The other man is our tried and tested old friend, Olof Hanson, who walked into the Skeena district before the railway was built without even a gunny sack in which to carry his clothes. He fought his way up and by hard work and untiring industry managed to reach a place where he could fight the election without drawing on campaign funds. The first time he was chosen as candidate he was elected and once since he has been re-elected. He is now well known to the Prime Minister and the other members of the Dominion cabinet as a man on whom they can rely. Even Prime Minister Bennett often sought his advice on important matters of state. He knows every corner of the district and tries to deal fairly with everyone. He is the man that we know. His record is before us.

BACK FROM METLAKATLA

Both were close matches, particularly the first one, a final quarter burst of scoring building up the New Metlakatla score. The Port Simpson team found the New Metlakatla Hall a little too warm to be comfortable but report that the gymnasium there is a splendid one.

Throughout their visit, the Port Simpson party was splendidly entertained at New Metlakatla. They took part in rededication services of the renovated Christian Church Monday there was a banquet in the Town Hall by the church choral society, the place being filled, visitors from Ketchikan, among others, being in attendance. The games were played Tuesday and Wednesday.

Led by David Musgrave, president of the Port Simpson Athletic Club, Allan and Paul Price, manager of the basketball team, the Port Simpson people left Prince Rupert this morning aboard their two boats for home where they are due to arrive early this afternoon. Mr. Price said that the Port Simpson Athletic Club was interested in a meeting of the Standard Oilers of Prince Rupert and they might be expected to be heard from later. Among those making the trip were Rev. T. C. Colwell, pastor of the Port Simpson United Church, who participated in the rededication services at the New Metlakatla Church.
