Norman McGlashan is sailing tonight on the Cardena for a holiday trip to Vancouver.

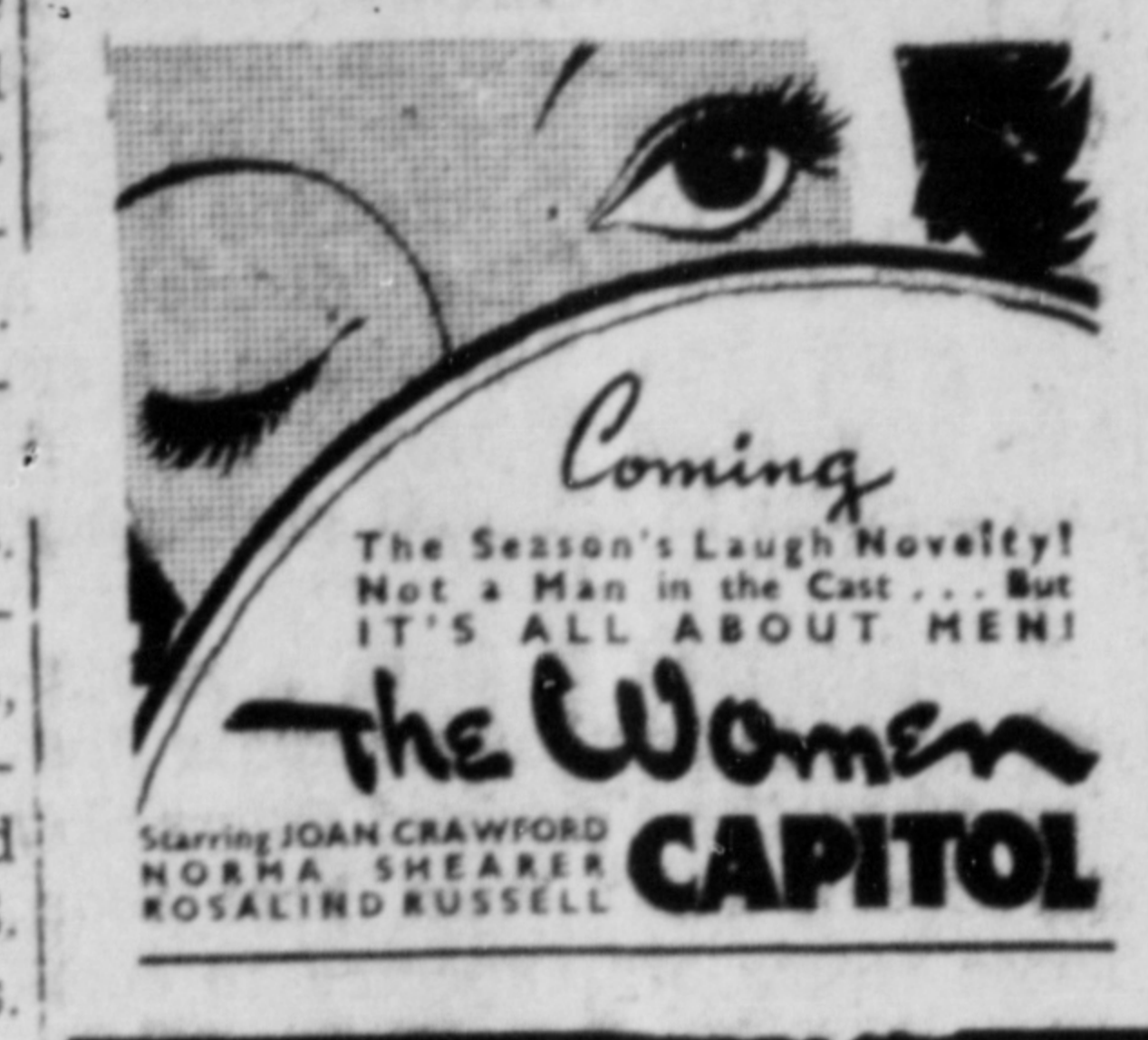
Mrs. M. C. Madill sailed last night on the Prince George for a business trip to Vancouver and elsewhere in the south.
