Records of the International Fisheries Commission show that from April 1 to September 30 this year a total of 24,832,879 pounds of halibut was landed at various ports of the Pacific coast from Area No. 3 as compared with 21,708,318 pounds in the corresponding period last year when the season was over a month longer. Landings of the American fleet this season from Area No. 3 were 23,256,442 pounds; as against 19,551,842 pounds. Canadian landings were 1,576,437 pounds in comparison with 2,156,476 pounds in 1939. During this September landings for the coast totalled 5,152,427 pounds including 4,516,144 pounds by American vessels and 636,283 pounds by Canadian.


BOWLING BY ARMY
