Log production in the Prince Rupert forestry district is keeping up well. The total scale for the month ending today was 36,874,400 board feet. This is made up of 16,666,844 feet of spruce and 10,046,036 feet of hemlock. There was also 7,613,747 feet of cedar and some balsam, fir and jackpine, a few ties and a little cordwood.
