WASHINGTON, D.C., Nov. 26 .-Total credits of European belligerants in the United States, which it is proposed to freeze, total an estimated \$3,500,000,000, the preponderance of which are British. Freezing of these assets, it is said, would not impede, but would rather facilitate, shipments of war materials from the United States to Britain. There would be a system of licensing such! shipments.
