GRAHAM COAL LANDS
 Bellamy Has Receiver Appointed to Collect Commission.

Vancouver, March 22.—The Royal Bank of Canada was yesterday constituted the receiver in connection with the assets of the Canadian Development Company upon the application of Mr. J. A. Clark, who asked Chief Justice Hunter in this way to secure the payment of monies due to his client, Mr. Henry R. Bellamy. The latter in his affidavit sets out that he brought about an exchange of properties between the development company and the Graham Island Collieries. He was to receive something over \$13,500. He states that he has been led to understand that a settlement is pending in connection with the

litigation between the two companies; that he has not been informed as to the nature of the settlement; and on these grounds wishes the payments still due him ensured. About \$8,900 has already been paid him.

More Reasons Why Wm. Manson Must be Defeated Stated by His Apologists

WHERE THE VOTES CLUSTER— RUPERT, STEWART, UP RIVER

RETURNS FROM THESE POINTS REPRESENTING 1,245 VOTES WILL BE PUBLISHED IN THE DAILY NEWS SPECIAL ON THURSDAY NIGHT—LOOKOUT FOR IT.

Voters list statistics for Skeena riding show that the bulk of the polling weight rests with Prince Rupert, Stewart, and the Skeena river points. In the district included here there are 1245 votes altogether. It is expected that the result of polling in Stewart and the Skeena points will be in Prince Rupert before 10 p.m. on Thursday. The polls close at 7 p.m. It will therefore be possible for the Daily News to get out an election extra with the result of the election as far as Stewart, Skeena river points and Prince Rupert are concerned by 10 p.m. Thursday.

In Masset, Naden Harbor and district 129 votes have to be accounted for. It will take two days to get the result from these points.

Bella Coola, Rivers Inlet and Namu represent 100 votes, and returns from these points will take four days to come in.

Ootsa Lake, and South and North Francois Lake districts represent 20 votes. Returns from these points cannot be expected for eight days after polling day.

It will be seen, however, that unless the voting is very close, the decision of the riding can be read in the returns from the districts more adjacent to Prince Rupert.
