WAR UPON BARBARISM

Stewart Barrister Is Interesting Speaker Before Luncheon Of Gyro Club

"The educated barbarian in Germany, Hitler, and the uneducated barbarian in Russia, Stalin, have one great common aim—the defeat of Great Britain and with it democracy and Christianity" was the way E. T. Applewhite, Stewart barrister, concluded an address before the Prince Rupert Gyro Club yesterday. "Both have a great hatred for civilized man. We should do everything in our power to see that the barbarian does not win this war. We should not take too much for granted and assume that, just because we won the last war, we are sure to win this one. Rather, we should all be ready to do our part, prepared to make sacrifices sympathetically should they be required of us."

Mr. Applewhite spoke in regard to the Canadian Legion War Services Inc. campaign which he made clear was a separate institution entirely from the regular function of the Legion in looking after the interests of veterans of the last war. The speaker dwelt more particularly with the aim of educating the soldiers in the present war so they would be prepared to take their place in civil life after the conflict was over.

Mr. Applewhite described how the community of Stewart had co-ordinated efforts in raising funds

for war activities. There had been one big drive which was to suffice for six months, the funds raised thereby to be allotted to the various calls such as Red Cross, Canadian Legion Inc., Salvation Army etc. The people, assured that there would not be various canvasses, had given to the best of their ability in response to the one appeal. The result was that more had been probably raised than would have been the case had there been various less systematic and thorough canvasses. The speaker was thanked for his business.
