ACCUSE SILENT BILL'S BOSSES

Government is Openly Charged With Graft—William Manson the Rubber Stamp.

Slashing indictments, alleging graft against the McBride administration backed up by powerful and convincing arguments in favor of the return of a strong opposition at the forthcoming provincial election, were the feature of the utterances at a largely attended meeting the other night in Vancouver. Mr. Ralph Smith exposed the rotten land laws and made the emphatic statement that three Victoria men, Messrs. Veitch, Kerr and Davis, had secured 42,500 acres of crown lands at \$2.50 per acre, which, without proper title had been placed on the British market at \$5.75 an acre, and moreover, that the firm of Bowser & Co. had transacted the legal business for them.

Another direct accusation made by Mr. Smith was that government surveyors in the pay of the McBride government had been sent north ostensibly for the purpose of surveying crown lands, and at the same time these surveyors had carried the names of friends in their pockets and staked off lands for them. They had even gone so far as to send letters to various persons asking that their names might be used in connection with this wholesale disposal of crown lands.

"We have good grounds for suspicion when they do not want an opposition," claimed Mr. Smith. "If everything was straight and above board they would have no reason to fear an opposition which might ask questions."

THREE WERE KILLED

Main Line of Great Northern Blocked by Rockslide

(Special to Daily News.) Sand Point, Idaho, March 25.—Three of the train crew were killed today when the Limited freight of the Great Northern plunged into a rock slide and down the embankment into the river. The main line is blocked by the slide.

CLUB WANTS SIDEWALK

Too Literal Exclusiveness Threatens the Club de Luxe of Prince Rupert — Members Petition Council—Ald. Webster's Stand.

Members of the Prince Rupert Club have petitioned the Council requesting that the plank sidewalk on Second Avenue passing their entrance be completed as the grading of the lane at the back is now being carried on so as to obstruct access to the club rooms as at present. Referred to the Board of Works for consideration and report.

Alderman Bullock — Webster suggested that the recommendation be added that this work be not carried on until earlier petitions for other sidewalks have been granted.

Alderman Morrissey pointed out that this work came in under Section 1 improvements, for which there is a balance of funds, and was only delayed for want of lumber. It has preference over other sections. Alderman Bullock—Webster withdrew his suggestion.

BRITAIN'S BIG BATTLESHIPS

Additional Units Under Construction for the British Fleet on April 1st—Estimates Reduced This Year.

On April 1, there will be under construction for Great Britain ten battleships, six cruisers, eight second class protected cruisers, thirty-one destroyers and fifteen submarines. The new construction includes four large armored ships, eight light armored cruisers, twenty destroyers and a number of submarines. The personnel will be increased by two thousand men.

The estimated expenditure on the British navy in the coming year, according to the government's report laid on the table of the House of Commons, is \$220,447,000, a decrease of \$1,535,500 on the amount spent last year.

The estimates for the current year are disappointing, as there were expectations of a large reduction. That this amount may be considerably exceeded is indicated by Mr. Churchill's statement that the estimates were framed on the assumption that the existing program of the other naval powers would not be increased. In the event of such an increase supplementary estimates would be necessary.
