DAY OF PRAYER

Prince Rupert Joins With Rest Of Empire In Appeal For Divine Intercession

Prince Rupert joined with the rest of the British Empire Sunday in observing a National Day of Prayer in intercession to God for the safety of the Empire and an Allied victory in the war crisis. There were especially large congregations in all city churches. Sermons of the pastors befitting the seriousness of the occasion and there were also special prayers.

At First Presbyterian Church in the morning members of the Imperial Order, Daughters of the Empire, under the municipal regent, Mrs. H. L. Landry, attended in a body, numbering about forty. The pastor, Rev. H. G. Funston, held that, equally if not more important than a strong armed force, was the support of that army with a citizenry of good men and women imbued with Godlike principles. He questioned the attitude toward God which had existed even in this very community and suggested that God today might be using the forces of evil to purge the world of sin and unrighteousness. The war would be more easily won if there was a return of God's principles without which, even though there might be a victory of arms, chaos could only ensue.

National Day of Prayer was also observed in the other city churches including Anglican, United and Baptist.

New York Stock Mart Is Weaker

All Averages Are Down Today in Stock Exchange Trading

NEW YORK, May 28.—The New York stock market had a firmer tone yesterday with 790,000 shares changing hands. Industrial average at closing was 116.35, up 1.69; rails 23.62 up .86, and utilities, 18.91, up .39. In view of unfavorable war news, the market plunged downward in early trading today with heavy losses in the first two hours during which trading volume totalled 790,000 shares. Industrials were down 4.77 at 111.58 average and rails down .83 at 22.49.

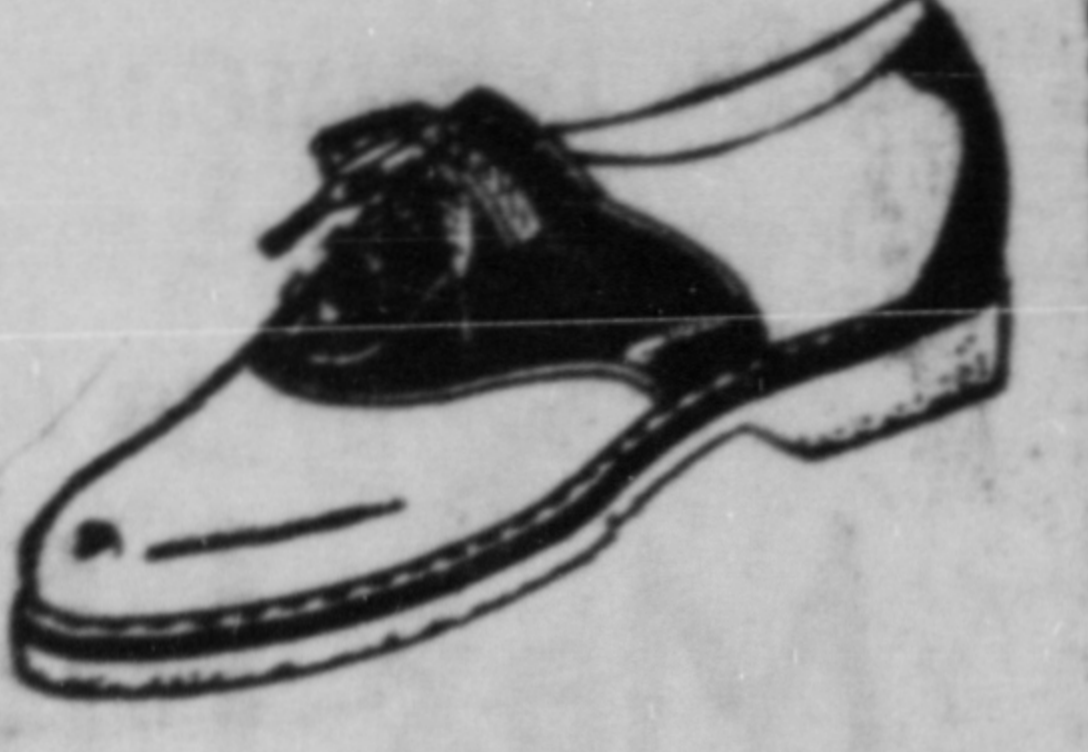
