## KETCHIKAN IS COMING

### International Series To Be Held February 21 and 22 Subject To Final Confirmation

It was announced officially this morning that the Standard Oilers have invited the Ketchikan All Stars to play here February 21 and 22. The games will be held in the Sixth Avenue Armory, total proceeds going to the Army funds. No word has been received from the Alaskans to date as to whether these dates are suitable or not although it is generally understood that they will accept the offer and show here.

A game between the Oilers and the Old Men's team is in the offing according to reports. The veterans have been taking the measure of some of the intermediate outfits and on that account wish a try-out against the senior team. This so-called band of oldsters are not to be considered slouches by any means even though they have not been actually cleaning up on the younger opponents. Their lineup consists of some former stars who, in their day, made city rep teams. Don Arney and Jack Lindsay both played for Premier when the Miners lost the Northern British Columbia Championship to the present champions, the Oilers, in 1937-38. Bill Lambie and Johnny Morrison played on the old all-star team that lost the championship to Premier in the previous year. With these four alone, the team, on paper, looks equally as formidable as even the Oilers and they have an array of newcomers little known to the public that should round out the sore spots should any occur.

A telegram has been received from New Metlakatla regarding a visit here on February 15 and 16. This has been considered a little too close for proper advertising and, as a result, the local authorities have informed them in this respect and asked them to hold over for at least another month.

Tickets for the Ketchikan series will be in the hands of the sellers as soon as possible after the word has been received of the Alaskans sailing date.
