The Canadian Red Cross Society has appropriated \$10,000 for the purchase of shoes and rubbers for air-raid victims in Great Britain.

NATION WIDE CAMPAIGN

A nation-wide campaign, in the women's and children's wear industry, for the making of at least \$100,000 worth of new winter clothing to be sent to the air-raid victims in the British Isles has been launched. The facilities of the Canadian Red Cross will be used to ship the clothing overseas where it will be distributed to those in most urgent need. All branches of the trade, including textile mills, will take part in the scheme and committees have already been formed.
