

## Timely Recipes

MACARONI WITH MUSHROOMS 1/2 package macaroni

1 oinon

2 ounces butter 4 tablespoons oil

2 slices of bacon

6 ounces of dried mushrooms or 1 lb. of fresh mushrooms

few sprigs parsley salt and pepper

Chop the onion, parsley butter, oil, salt and pepper and let fry until the onion becomes, golden brown. Add the mushrooms (if they are dried mushrooms.) they must be parboiled).
