Evacuee Escorts Are Hand-Picked

Overseas Board Makes Sure People Bringing Children Over Are Qualified

MANCHESTER, July 26: (CP)—Many women—and men too—who have offered their services to escort children travelling overseas to the dominions for sanctuary from German air-bombing are examined by the Children's Overseas Reception Board. Some are rejected.

One of the problems facing the board is to find the right type of men and women to undertake the responsible task of caring for children between the ages of five and 16 on a long sea voyage. Applicants are put through a searching test by the board. They must have had experience in controlling and looking after groups of children; knowledge of child welfare is highly important and the applicant must be

a good sailor. School teachers, welfare workers and nurses used to see their care have been disembarked and the reception organization has taken charge of them, the escorts there and back. Expenses will be paid, embarkation till return to the home port.

EDITORIAL

CANADIAN FORCES ACTIVE

It seems evident from the dispatches that the policing of points on the Atlantic coast not covered by European nationals is being handled by Canadians. This gets away from any interference of the Monroe doctrine under which European powers are barred from taking over territory on this hemisphere. Greenland and the West Indies come within that category. Canada is protecting Greenland from invasion by German or Italian forces and also any of the West Indies not already protected. Also there are Canadian forces temporarily occupying the Danish island of Iceland to prevent Germans making it a base for attacks upon Great Britain.

TRIUMPH OF MORALE

The successful withdrawal of the British forces from Dunkirk is described in the Oxford Periodical History of the War as a triumph of discipline and morale. The Germans had announced that the "fate of the French and British armies was sealed." It did not seem to the ordinary military observer as if the quarter of a million men there could possibly escape.

Praise is given the French tank corps which was fighting a heroic rearguard action under General Prioux. This corps, when cut off from the main body of the army, succeeded in smashing its way through. The story of how, under a withering fire from air and land, the British and French troops were slowly embarked in hundreds of great and small craft until, when the Germans eventually entered Dunkirk all were gone, is an epic in retreat, the story of which has often been told.

We are mentioning it again because it was the same morale which turned a defeat into almost a victory. This obtains today in Britain. The people there are perfectly organized and they know what to expect. They cannot be beaten. That, together with the growing strength of the air force and the preponderant strength of the British navy, will bring victory.
