EDITORIAL

CANADIAN FORCES ACTIVE

It seems evident from the dispatches that the policing of points on the Atlantic coast not covered by European nationals is being handled by Canadians. This gets away from any interference of the Monroe doctrine under which European powers are barred from taking over territory on this hemisphere. Greenland and the West Indies come within that category. Canada is protecting Greenland from invasion by German or Italian forces and also any of the West Indies not already protected. Also there are Canadian forces temporarily occupying the Danish island of Iceland to prevent Germans making it a base for attacks upon Great Britain.

TRIUMPH OF MORALE

The successful withdrawal of the British forces from, Dunkirk is described in the Oxford Periodical History of the War as a triumph of discipline and morale. The Germans had announced that the "fate of the French and British armies was sealed." 

which has often been told. We are mentioning it again because it was the same morale which turned a defeat into almost a victory. This obtains today in Britain. The people there are perfectly organized and they know what to expect. They cannot be beaten. That, together with the growing strength of the air force and the preponderant strength of the British navy, will bring victory.
