

**Coast Highway Defence Road**

SAN FRANCISCO, July 26: (CP)—America's defence program has revived plans for an Alaska-to-Argentina highway.

The road has long been advocated by western motoring organizations. It again has been brought to the attention of Congress by Thomas P. Henry of Detroit, president of the American Automobile Association, who points out it would be valuable for moving troops and munitions. Existing highways form part of the route. Some of the longest routes yet to be developed are in Canada and Central America.
