
## WHO STARTED THE WAR?

Evidently, there has been some discussion in Prince Rupert as to who started the present war. If a bandit runs amok robbing and killing and a policeman suddenly stops him, who starts that war? Was it the bandit or the policeman when Germany marched into CzechoSlovakia? At Munich the British and French had induced the Czechs to give up part of their country where Germans predominated so that a war might be avoided. The Germans marched in and took the whole country and have been shooting down all who opposed even up to within the past week. Germany was told that, if she invaded Poland, it would mean war. She went ahead and invaded the country, slaughtering men, women and children and destroying the you. cities. She had to be stopped. That meant war. It was the same man who gave way to the Germans at Munich who asked the British government to declare war against them in Poland. It was Prime Minister Chamberlain-all honor to him.

Now it looks like a war to the death in which Canada is taking part. So far we have felt it very little. We have suffered no hardships and, with the exception of a few airmen, no Canadians have taken part. We are told that the big war has not yet started. When it does our men will be engaged and they will need support. At any cost Germany has to be stopped in her wild rampage of banditry.

Had Britain and France refused to fight for Poland you immediately. the Germans today would have controlled Norway and Sweden. Denmark, Belgium, France, Britain and Canada Lost and would have been threatening the existence of the United States. Happily our statesmen had the courage of their convictions and the Germans were stopped.


