WEEK-END FILM BILL

"The Saint Takes Over" And "Pop Always Pays" Comprise Double Feature Program

"The Saint Takes Over," story of a resourceful super-crook's campaign to save the reputation of a police inspector in his time of need, and "Pop Always Pays," an hilarious comedy, comprise the double bill for this afternoon and evening at the Capitol Theatre here.

George Sanders, Wendy Barrie and Jonathan Hale head the cast of "The Saint Takes Over." George Sanders again plays the title role of the noted fiction figure of "The Saint." Jonathan Hale plays the part of the police inspector while Miss Barrie has the feminine lead as a vengeful girl out to get retribution for the death of her brother at the hands of a ring. 'XMAS SEAL CAMPAIGN

Plans Under Way For Sale Here as Well as Elsewhere

Plans for the annual Christmas Seal campaign, the proceeds of which are used to combat tuberculosis in the province, are now under way in this as well as other communities. Keen appreciation of the work of the society in fighting the White Plague in the province is expressed by Dr. N. M. Carter, patron of the Christmas Seal Campaign, who urges citizens to continue to support this very necessary crusade.

"With the war at a critical stage, the need for close control of tuberculosis cannot be over-emphasized," says a statement. "The Dominion government recognizes the danger of tuberculosis to the defence forces and takes adequate measures to meet it.

"The people in general must recognize the equal danger to themselves and help provincial and voluntary health agencies prevent the disease. Public funds are not readily available for clinic, survey and educational preventive work that means so much in checking tuberculosis.

"Such funds can be raised through the sale of Christmas Seals, which offer an attractive and effective way of providing protection for the public. Nearly 32,000 clinical examinations were made in B.C. last year. At least that many, and preferably more, must be made this year and next to help keep Canada strong."

Waterfront Whiffs

Herring Run is Now Being Awaited—Local Cannery Was Last to Close

With no other fishing activity in sight in the meantime, watch is now being kept out for herring to put in an appearance hereabouts. It is still, however, a little early as the run did not commence last year until mid-November. As soon as the fish become available in seining quantities, reduction plants at Tucks Inlet, Port Edward and elsewhere along the north coast will start operations. The usual bait requirements are also to be put up.

After a long season of production which included a substantial pack of fall varieties, Nelson Bros. Fisheries Ltd. cannery on the Ocean Dock here was the last salmon packing plant in this district to close down. It will resume operations later on herring canning, preparations for same being under way.

On a regular voyage from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands Union steamer Venture, Capt. George Coles, arrived in port at 12:30 noon today and will sail at 8 o'clock tonight on her return south over the same route.

The Canadian Fishing Co. is planning to commence operations on herring at its Butedale reduction and canning plant next week, according to word received in the city. The plant will provide employment for native labor from Kitimaat in addition to the regular staff.

Indian Department's cruiser Naskeena is on a ten-day trip down the coast to such points as Kitkatla, Kitimaat, Hartley Bay, Klemtnu, Bella Bella and Bella Coola with James Coleman of Vancouver, inspector of Indian agencies, who is making a tour of the district on official duties. The Naskeena left on Wednesday of this week and is expected back about the end of next week. Indian Agent James Gillett, who went as far as Butedale with the Naskeena, returned to the city on the Cardena last evening.

A German language broadcast by the British Broadcasting Corporation said that a German expedition of fifty men had been captured in an unsuccessful attempt to seize the observation station in Greenland. A Norwegian patrol boat made them prisoners, the broadcast said.

BURMESE SMALL CHANGE
RANGOON, Burma, Nov. 2: (CP)—Burma now has a stamp valued at one pie—a sixth of a cent. The stamp will be used for carrying light newspapers.

School In Which She Taught Has Been Destroyed
